Midwives must telephone screen all women prior to any face to face visit

For women who do not have COVID-19, and are not in 14-day isolation; standard precautions are still required as per normal practice.

Also use these precautions if a woman is generally unwell with a respiratory illness. Ask the woman to wear a mask, if possible, when providing cares.
